

Liverpool City Intergroup – Aims, Services, and Contact Information

Liverpool City Intergroup exists to support local AA groups and carry the message of recovery to alcoholics who still suffer. It operates in alignment with AA's traditions, focusing solely on helping individuals recover—not on research, treatment, or advocacy.

Core Purpose

The Intergroup functions as a central service body, supporting individual AA groups throughout Liverpool. It respects group autonomy while helping coordinate services and outreach efforts.

Key Roles & Services

Meeting Coordination

- - Supports around 62 face-to-face meetings across Liverpool daily, plus an internet meeting.
- Maintains up-to-date listings and publishes announcements when meetings change.

Telephone Service

- - Operates a 24-hour helpline: +44 (0) 800 917 7650.

Public & Professional Outreach

- - Liaises with health services, probation, prisons, and community organizations.
- Distributes posters and literature with AA contact info.

Events & Assembly Governance

- - Hosts Intergroup Assemblies (e.g., next on 20 July 2025 at the Rotunda).
- Coordinates officer roles including Chair, Secretary, PI Officer, etc.

Insurance for Groups

- - Provides third-party insurance coverage up to £5 million.
